

## 2012 Lenten Preachers



**Feb. 22 – 24: Phyllis Tickle** is the founding editor of the Religion Department of Publishers Weekly, the international journal of the book industry and is a leading authority on religion in America and. She is also a prolific author and writer, with over two dozen books, most recently, *The Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why*.



**Feb. 27 – 28: Diana Butler Bass** is an author, speaker, and independent scholar specializing in American religion and culture. She is the author of eight books including *Birth of a New Spiritual Awakening*. She consults with religious organizations and leads conferences for religious leaders. She also blogs and regularly comments on religion in the media.



**Feb. 29 – 2: Bishop Eugene Sutton** is the Bishop of Maryland. He founded Contemplative Outreach of Metropolitan Washington (COMW), an ecumenical network of churches and individuals committed to empowering the gospel for daily living. Bishop Sutton has published several articles is a contributor to “The Diversity of Centering Prayer.”



**Mar 5 – 9: The Rev. Dr. Jim Somerville** is the Pastor of Richmond’s First Baptist Church. He has a Christian freshness that maintains its integrity in his spiritual journey, daily approach to life, church leadership and in the care and use of his physical abilities. Jim is perhaps best known for his remarkable gift of storytelling in which he teaches spiritual and life truths.



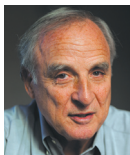
**Mar. 12 – 16: Bishop John S. Spang** is the author of more than twenty books that have sold over a million copies. He was an Episcopal bishop for more than 24 years. Since 2010, his portrait has hung in the Hall of Honor at the Martin Luther King Jr. International Chapel at Morehouse College with other civil rights movement leaders for his work as a champion of justice.



**Mar. 19 – 23: The Rev. Dr. Derik Jones** is the pastor of the historic First Baptist Church of South Richmond, Virginia. Dr. Jones sits on the Board of Directors of the Imani Community Development Corporation, the Greater Richmond YMCA, and is a member of the Capital Region Collaborative, a think tank that brings community leaders together to improve the local quality of life.



**Mar. 26 – 27: Bishop Michael Curry** is the Bishop of North Carolina. Bishop Curry had extensive involvement in Crisis Control Ministry, founding ecumenical summer day camps for children; preaching missions; the Absalom Jones initiative; creating networks of family day care providers; creating educational centers; and brokering investment in inner city neighborhoods.



**Mar. 28– 30: The Rev. Benjamin Campbell** is the Pastoral Director of Richmond Hill, an ecumenical Christian community and retreat center on Church Hill in Richmond; and he recently authored *Richmond’s Unhealed History*. Ben builds bridges, turning prayer into a call for social justice and reconciliation in a community still broken from segregation and Massive Resistance.



**April 2-4: The Rev. Dr. Joan S. Parrott** is the Executive Minister of First Baptist Church of Hampton, Virginia. Dr. Parrott continues to strive for a life of compassion, integrity and excellence, where her actions and deep faith in God are a paradigm of servant-leadership and a sign of hope in a divided world.

Reservations for groups of five or more may be made by calling 804-643-3589. Please call by 10:30 a.m. on the day you wish to attend.

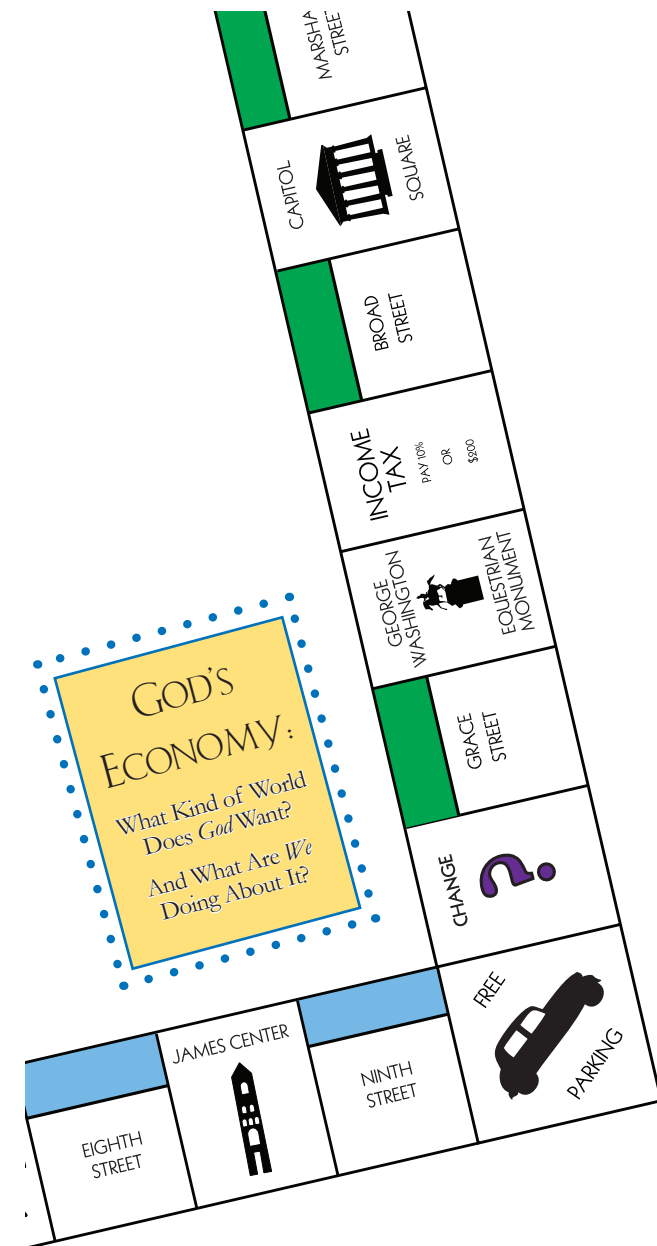
## GRANT RECIPIENTS
